Lake Fork was permitted by SRA to be developed exactly as they have been developed. Each park is inspected annually and required to correct any problems found within a specific time frame. SRA does follow-up inspections to make sure requirements are met. Failure to correct the problems would result in the loss of the permit. Park owners 3. are required to have liability insurance and co-insure the SRA. Each park pay fees to lease the leaseback AND they also pay property tax to Wood County on the lease-

Completes Purchase of Lake Colorado City State Park TPWD

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) recently announced it has purchased Lake Colorado City State Park in Mitchell County.

Prior to the purchase, TPWD leased the 500acre park from Vistra and its predecessors for more than 50 years. To purchase the property, TPWD utilized funding from Sporting Goods Sales Tax which was dedicated to the department through the passage of Proposition 5 in 2019. The proposition dedicates 93 percent of sales taxes on sporting goods to support state parks, historic sites and local park grants.

"I am thrilled that we were able to complete the transaction that will ensure public access to Lake Colorado City State Park for future generations of Texans," said Rodney Franklin, director of Texas State Parks. "Thanks to the support of our legislature and the voters of Texas, we will continue to acquire and protect the wild spaces of Texas."

"Vistra's Texas roots go back more than 140 dry West Texas climate. years, and we value our longtime partnership with Texas Parks and Wildlife," said Kyle Box, place and we are thrilled that the park will convice president of real estate at Vistra. "We're proud to have been able to provide public access to this privately owned land and lake for the last 50 years through a no-cost lease, and now it's exciting to see this land in new hands but serving its same purpose – as a respite for our fellow Texans."

Located south of I-20 between Midland and Abilene, Colorado City State Park sits on the banks of the Vistra-owned Lake Colorado City, which serves as a cooling reservoir for Vistra's power plant. Vistra will continue to provide an easement for lake access to park visitors. The park and lake have been a place for visitors to swim, fish, boat, paddle, hike, camp, and enjoy nature since 1971. Last year, more than 24,000 visitors enjoyed the park as a respite from the

"Lake Colorado City State Park is a special tinue to be a respite where people can recreate outdoors and build lasting memories that they can revisit year after year," said Leslie Mc-Guigan, interim superintendent of Lake Colorado City State Park.

Lake Colorado City State Park is the most recent example of TPWD using the Sporting Goods Sales Tax fund to acquire park land. In September, the department acquired 630 acres adjacent to Enchanted Rock State Natural Area near Fredericksburg, allowing for the expansion of one of the state's most popular sites.

for Construction State Park Garner to Partially Close

The southern section of Garner State Park closed Dec. 1 to allow the Texas Department of Transportation and Texas Parks and Wildlife Department to complete road construction and facility repairs.

Construction is expected to last until summer 2025 with a limited reopening in March.

"As one of the most popular parks in the state, Garner consistently sees a steady flow of visitors wanting to swim in the Frio River or hike Old Baldy," said Jaime Creacy, regional director for Texas State Parks. "Though we are glad everyone is enjoying these iconic Central Texas vistas, the high volume of visitors at the park through much of the year hinders our ability to do large scale maintenance projects to our most popular areas. It is our hope that by completing these necessary construction projects during the slower winter months, we will be able to better serve our visitors in time for their upcoming spring and summer vacations."

Areas affected by the closure include the Pecan hiking and biking trails, a playscape and the Grove and Oakmont camping loops and cabins, the pavilion, park store, mini-golf, Garner Grill, boat house, day-use picnic area, Frio River dam and rock beach.

Additionally, all trails will be closed except for page. the Nature Trail and the Frio Canyon Trail.

"Once construction is complete, we hope folks will be able to have a better experience when visiting Garner," said Creacy. "For example, one of the repairs we will be focusing on is the scenic overlook on Park Road 29 along the Madrone Trail which has been closed for three years. We are excited that visitors will be able to experience and use it again."

During the closure, visitors will still have access to more than 200 campsites available at the River Crossing, Shady Meadows, Rio Frio, Live Oak and Persimmon Hill campgrounds. The Cypress Springs Group area will also be open along with the group hall, 3.5- miles of

bird-viewing blind. The park will continue offering interpretive programming and activities. For more information about the park, including the closure, visit the Garner State Park web-

What a fantastic time of year, as we have all the fishing seasons and their respective patterns to look forward to on this historic fishery. I don't know about you, but I enjoy them all and the different techniques and lures that we use in each.

This month is a great time to lock a jerkbait in your hand and look forward to big Winter Bass suspend-

ed in timber, around bridge columns or near steeper banks/ drops/ points. I prefer 12 or 15 lb test Seaguar InvizX Fluorocarbon Line and a 6' 8" to 7' medium light to medium action rod for this technique, depending on cover present. A standard depth jerkbait and a deeper diving jerkbait are good to have on the deck. You can vary the depths these lures attain, and how they suspend or sink, by using suspend dots/strips or adding bigger or heavier gauge hooks. On sunny days, bass will rise in the warmer upper layer, making them vulnerable for the jerkbait. These fish are generally going to be near deeper water, as they like to move vertically this time of year to find their preferred water temperature.

The jig is the other iconic Winter Big Bass lure to have tied on in Winter. A pitching style for working timber and the root systems of such and a football jig for points, roadbeds, etc. With a pitching/ flipping jig, look for creek channel bends and the larger stumps along the creek channels. Throw in a creek channel swing bank and all the better. I like a 7' to 7' 6" Medium Heavy rod and 20 lb test Seaguar InvizX fluorocarbon line for this technique. Cast past the stump and

work the jig, with your favorite trailer, up to stump and roots. A 1/2 oz to 3/4 oz jig are usually the best.

It's also beginning to be time to have the East Texas legendary Red lipless crankbait tied on and ready to sling. Pro Tip on this lure is to use a Yo-Yo retrieve, sometimes, or all the time. Make long casts and let the lure hit the bottom or grass/vegetation and then sweep your rod up, lower your rod toward the lure while taking up some slack, but allowing lure to hit bottom, again. They'll often hit it on the drop or bottom, thus a high speed gear ratio reel is necessary to take up the

slack. I prefer a 7' 3" Medium Heavy rod and 17 to 20 lb Seaguar InvizX fluorocarbon for the lipless crankbait. Areas to fish these lures are red clay banks/ points, flats on warmer afternoons or any areas with submerged vegetation. A 1/2to 3/4 oz lipless crankbait is recommended this time of year.

Weather is important to pay attention to this month, as far as gear and fishing is concerned. Be sure to layer up accordingly for the cold and wind and carry extra clothes and a towel, in case you get wet or take an unexpected plunge! Wear those PFD's as hypothermia is real if you end up in the water.

Public Access Lease Opening for Guadalupe River Trout Fishing

for rainbow trout fishing during the peak of the winter stocking season thanks to a Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) "no fee" access lease on the Guadalupe River.

Camp Huaco Springs, located between New Braunfels and Sattler, features nearly a half mile of bank access along alternating pools and riffles on the Guadalupe River. Anglers can use the bank, which is gently sloped and rocky, or wade fish both upstream and downstream to take advantage of a low-water dam at the upper end of the property or a deep pool at the lower end. They can also launch non-motorized boats, canoes, kayaks or other floatable devices for the purpose of fishing.

Public access opened Dec. 6 and is available through March 3 from 30 minutes before sunrise to 30 minutes after sunset.

"This lease location provides great bank angler access to river trout fishing coupled with gor-

Texas anglers have access to a prime location geous Guadalupe River scenery," said Patrick Ireland, TPWD Inland Fisheries Division San trout regulations, so anglers may keep up to Marcos and Austin District Supervisor.

> TPWD will stock this and other sections of the Guadalupe River, also known as the Canyon Reservoir Tailrace, with more than 20,000 rainbow trout during weekly stockings from early December through late February. The stocking locations include Guadalupe Park at the dam, fourth and third river crossings on River Road and Camp Huaco Springs.

> The Guadalupe River Unlimited Chapter (GRTU), a partner of TPWD, also stocks Rainbow Trout throughout the river during the colder months. The GRTU trout are typically larger than TPWD stock. Anglers should check the 2024-25 Trout Stocking Schedule online before fishing to confirm the date and to find other winter trout stocking program angling locations and tips.

Camp Huaco Springs falls under statewide their daily bag limit of five trout with no minimum length limit. Trout anglers 17 years of age and older will need a valid fishing license that includes a freshwater fishing endorsement.

Anglers may find public access to the river in other areas being stocked with trout – including Guadalupe Park, operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers – but should note that special regulations and limits are in effect starting 800 yards downstream from the Canyon Dam release to the second bridge crossing on River Road.

Camp Huaco Springs is located at 4150 River Road in New Braunfels. For more information, or to find leased River Access and Conservation Areas (RACA) on other rivers in Texas, visit the RACA program website.

"Lake Fork Crappie January 2025"

First I want to wish everyone a "Happy, Blessed, and Prosperous 2025! Also I want to sincerely thank all of you that fished with me in 2024 with so many memorable moments! I appreciate you all!

I know January will bring cooler temperatures, with not as many fishable days -but, on those days be sure and check out the Boat and Tackle shows in your area. It's amazing to see the growth of the crappie fishing industry. From tackle to trolling motors, to electronics, and even the boat manufacturers are getting on board. There is even bigger and better payouts for the Crappie Tournaments giving way to more television coverage ad exposure. So, whether you fish a little or a lot it's always fun to go to these tackle shows to check out all the latest inventions, and pick up some new things to try when the weather permits a fishable day.

Now as far as the crappie fishing - with the dropping water temperatures, the crappie will congregate out deeper in anywhere between 30 to 55 ft. along bends or intersections of creek channels, the 154 and 515 bridges are known winter hotspots, and deep water timber or brush piles, and deep water humps. Just watch your graph to see how deep you need to target. The colder water makes the fish less aggres-



sive, so a subtle presentation is key. The only problem with this time of year is the crazy wind we've had to deal with. It's not easy trying to find 40 - 50 ft. of water out of the wind!

I usually use a 1/16 or 1/8oz. jighead but when its windier I'll go to a $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. In the hair jigs, Skippers in black and chartreuse or pink and chartreuse have been working. In the plastics, Bonehead brush gliders in silver shad or slick neon have been producing. But, don't be afraid to change up colors to adjust to conditions. All of these baits are available at Lake Fork Marina along with any of your fishing needs. There is also a new Berkley bait out called the Power Switch that features a weight forward design for fast drop-ins to quickly get your bait in front of the fish. They come in 1-3/4 inch up to 5 inches and comes in 14 colors. The 3-inch is perfect for this time of year because it's matching the size of the shad they've been eating. This bait was made for bass

fishing – but, I've found the crappie love them too! These are also available at Lake Fork Marina.

I don't know about you – but, I'm sure hoping for a milder winter this year (and a little less wind would be awesome!)

Looks like Lake Fork is being celebrated as one of the top crappie fishing destinations along with trophy bass. Lake Fork doesn't disappoint - even in January. You just need to pick a nice day-bundle up, grab some hand-warmers, and your gear, the rewards are well worth braving the cold! Just keep thinking - Spring is just around the corner! 

Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza Causes Several Mortality Events in Texas Birds

The National Veterinary Services Laboratories (NVSL) confirmed the presence of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) in multiple locations throughout the state. Disease experts indicate that HPAI is circulating among wild birds in Texas as waterbirds and waterfowl are on their wintering grounds.

Most recent detections have been found in Wharton, Galveston, and Harris counties.

Detected in all states across the U.S., HPAI is a highly contagious virus that transmits easily among wild and domestic birds. The virus can spread directly between animals and indirectly

through environmental contamination.

Because of the ease of transmission, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) recommends wildlife rehabilitators remain cautious when intaking wild animals with clinical signs consistent with HPAI and consider quarantining animals to limit the potential for HPAI exposure to other animals within the facility.

The public can assist in interrupting HPAI transmission by limiting all unnecessary contact with wild birds. Bird feeders and water sources should be cleaned at least every two weeks with a solution of one part bleach to nine parts water.

Change water in birdbaths every few days and regularly remove wet feed and seed from feed and water sources.

Additionally, game bird hunters should consider precautions such as:

* Disposing carcasses properly

* Wearing gloves when processing

* Avoiding consumption or processing of any sick bird

* Cleaning and disinfecting tools between carcasses

* Cooking meat to proper temperatures

Currently, the transmission risk of avian influenza from infected birds to people remains low, but the public should take basic protective measures if contact with wild animals cannot be avoided. The public and health care professionals can find more information about HPAI in humans from the Texas Department of State Health Services. If you had contact with an HPAI-positive animal and develop signs of illness, immediately contact your health care provider and let them know about the exposure.

If you encounter a wild animal with signs consistent with HPAI, contact your local TPWD wildlife biologist.

Toyota ShareLunker Program Wraps Up Another Outstanding Collection Season

The 2024 Toyota ShareLunker program was full speed ahead and produced an exceptional year.

Anglers contributed 19 Legacy Class Share-Lunkers from seven different lakes throughout Texas. Three new waterbodies recorded their first Legacy Class fish.

"Thank you to everyone involved in making another great Toyota ShareLunker collection season," said Natalie Goldstrohm, Toyota ShareLunker program coordinator. "We're grateful that so many anglers caught their fish of a lifetime this season and then decided to share their ShareLunker to support a future full of bigger, better bass in Texas."

TPWD biologists implemented a genetic analysis of this year's Legacy Lunkers and made some incredible discoveries. For example, they determined ShareLunker 666, reeled in by Larry R. Walker from O.H. Ivie, was a recapture of ShareLunker 646 originally caught by Mechelda Criswell on Feb. 27, 2023.

A 13.20-pound fish from Lake Athens proved

to be the offspring of ShareLunker 552 which was caught by Randall E. Claybourne on Jan. collection season for the fourth consecutive 12, 2014 at Lake Fork. This is the first time a Legacy Class descendant from this specific family tree was discovered in the ShareLunker strohm. "We continue to learn from these exprogram.

Of the 19 Legacy Class ShareLunkers, 13 of the fish had secondary relationships to either previous Legacy Class fish or other ShareLunkers that anglers submitted scale samples for genetic analyses. Tissue from a pair of full siblings from Oak Creek were submitted by Criswell through the ShareLunker app. One of these fish was caught in 2023 and the other in 2024. All of these findings highlight the valued partnership that the ShareLunker program facilitates with anglers throughout the world.

Unfortunately, one of this year's 19 Legacy Class fish, the 13.42-pound ShareLunker 662 from Inks Lake, perished due to extenuating circumstances. However, in the last five years, the program has achieved an excellent overall fish survival success rate of 94 percent. The last time a Legacy Lunker perished in TPWD care

was more than four years ago, in 2021.

"The TPWD hatchery teams work diligently to provide the absolute best fish healthcare for each and every ShareLunker bass," said Goldperiences and further refine big bass healthcare and life supporting treatments."

Anglers who caught and loaned one of these 13-plus pound lunkers earn Legacy Class status, receive a catch kit filled with merchandise, a 13lb+ Legacy decal for their vehicle or boat, VIP access to the Toyota ShareLunker Annual Awards event, a high-quality replica mount of their fish from Lake Fork Taxidermy, and Bass University will provide a swag pack and annual subscription. These anglers also receive entries into two separate drawings - a Legacy Class Drawing and the year-end Grand Prize Drawing. Both drawings will award the winner a \$5,000 Bass Pro Shops shopping spree.

While the Legacy class season has ended, the year-round Toyota ShareLunker program offers anglers three additional levels of participation

for catching bass over eight pounds or 24 inches in Texas. Each of these levels still provide vital data to TPWD fisheries biologists, helping them to continue to create bigger, better bass in Texas.

Anglers who enter data for any lunker they catch greater than eight pounds or 24 inches during the 2024 calendar year also receive a catch kit, a decal for their vehicle or boat, a onemonth subscription to Bass University and an entry into the year-end Grand Prize Drawing to win a \$5,000 Bass Pro Shops shopping spree. ShareLunker entry classes include the Bass Pro Shops Lunker Class (8 lb.+), Strike King Elite Class (10 lb.+) and Lew's Legend Class (13 1b.+).

Once a lunker is reeled in, anglers need to enter the catch data on the Toyota ShareLunker mobile app – available for free from the Apple App Store and Google Play – or on the Toyota ShareLunker online app at TexasSharelunker. com.


In addition to providing basic catch informa-

tion, anglers have the option to send a DNA Forecast, Bass University, Lake Fork Taxiderscale sample from their lunker bass to TPWD researchers for genetic analysis. Anglers who send in a genetic sample will also get a three-month subscription to Bass University. Instructions for submitting DNA samples are located on the Toyota Share-Lunker website.



Longview Mountain Lion 83.5 pounds.

In the early morning hours on Tuesday, Dec. 10, a mountain lion was struck by a Longview Police Department (LPD) patrol vehicle. The police department contacted the Gregg County Game Warden and coordinated the retrieval of the deceased lion.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) staff took possession of the deceased lion to collect DNA and other biological samples. The lion was estimated to be a 3-4-year-old female weighing



Several of the samples will be sent to the Caesar Kleberg Wildlife Research Institute as part of an ongoing research project and some were retained by TPWD staff as part of our effort to learn more about mountain lions in Texas.

In Texas, mountain lions are primarily found in the Trans-Pecos and parts of South Texas, however individual lions can move long distances and can show up in areas where they are not typically known to occur.

- * Sex of the lion

* Age class of the lion (kitten/subadult/ adult)

* Method of take

* Effort (how many days hunted/trapped)

* Photographs in specific poses (so TPWD can verify sex and age)

* Optional text box for providing any other information

Users who already have the app download-More information about mountain lions can be ed on their devices will need to update to the new version to get all the latest features and to ensure proper app functionality.



The following items are compiled from recent Texas Parks and Wildlife Department law enforcement reports.

--When Will You Learn?-- Two Polk County game wardens were on night patrol with their deer decoy "Corby" when Corby caught someone's eye. A truck passed the decoy, slowed to a stop, then quickly reversed and the headlights were positioned onto the decoy. After a brief pause, the sound of a small caliber rifle shot was heard from the vehicle. The war-

dens approached the subject and they were apprehended without incident. A .22 caliber rifle was found in the back seat of the truck with a spent casing still in the ejection port of the rifle. The subject also admitted to being charged for spotlighting on a public roadway near the same area a few weeks prior to this incident by a different Polk County game warden. The subject was charged with hunting white-tailed deer at night, hunting white-tailed deer using artificial light and multiple Class C citations

and warnings. Cases pending.

--Liar Liar Deer on Fire--An Upshur County game warden received a call about two deer carcasses dumped along a shared fence line with a neighbor. The caller said the two carcasses had not been quartered and only some of the meat had been taken off of the two deer. The warden called for additional back up from another warden and when they arrived at the property, the two deer were no longer on the fence line. The (Continued on Page 24)

wardens interviewed the property owner, but he denied knowledge of the two deer. After a quick investigation, it was determined that a nine-point buck was harvested that morning by his juvenile son. When asked about the carcass, the landowner said they had taken the carcass to a creek a mile away to dispose of it. When questioned about the second deer, the landowner continued to deny claims of there being another deer. After further questioning, the landowner confessed to not harvesting all of the meat from the nine-point buck that morning and showed the wardens to a burn pile on the property where they found the wasted buck with its two front shoulders intact and on fire. The landowner continued to deny there had been another deer until one of the wardens found a partially quartered doe hidden in the high brush. The landowner then confessed. Multiple cases pending.


--If I Could Turn Back Time-- Henderson County game wardens were conducting an inspection on a local processor when they came across a license that did not have an archery endorsement. During the inspection, wardens found out the deer was harvested the same day the license was purchased, but the license was bought by the hunter later in the evening. The wardens visited the hunter and learned that the deer was harvested under the license of another individual. After further questioning, it was discovered that the hunter asked his wife to go buy a hunting license the same day he harvested the deer so that he could use her tag to harvest another buck. After denying the incident, the wardens were able to use cell phone photos with consent from the couple to put together a timeline proving the deer was harvested by the hunter before the license was purchased by his wife. To further the false claims that his wife had harvested the deer, he had her pose for photos with the deer, which wardens found on the phone. Cases pending.

--Oh Deer--A Lavaca County game warden was on patrol when they heard a rifle shot come from an area where they had previously seen deer hunting violations. When they went to investigate, the warden saw a man drive out of the brush, head home, pick up his wife and then

return to the woods. An hour later, the wife returned to the house with the head and meat of a white-tailed buck. The warden approached the wife, who then lead the warden to where she was meeting her husband in the woods. The man was surprised when his wife showed up with the game warden to their hidden cleaning rack. Citation was issued for taking a white-tailed deer in closed season and civil restitution was filed. Case pending.

--Crossbow Drive-by-- Two Trinity County game wardens received a call from the local sheriff's office about a hunter who had just shot a buck in a yard from a vehicle. The landowner thought a rifle was used and was able to write down the license plate number and get a good description of the vehicle. The wardens and sheriff's office called a local constable who lives in the same neighborhood for some back up. The constable was able to find the vehicle quickly while the wardens traveled to the scene. After a brief interview upon their arrival, the hunter

admitted to shooting the buck out of his vehicle with a crossbow from the public roadway. Wardens filed multiple charges for hunting from the public roadway and hunting during closed season. Cases pending.

--Drunk and on the Hunt-- A Cass County game warden was on patrol when they saw a vehicle stop twice near a large pasture and stick what they thought was a rifle out of the window. While following the vehicle to confirm what they had seen, the subject was driving erratically on the county road. When the vehicle stopped again, the warden conducted a traffic stop. The warden then approached the vehicle and saw an AR-15 rifle in the passenger's seat. The weapon was secured, and the driver was checked for warrants. The warden noticed the thermal scope was still on, so they asked the driver about hunting and told him that they had seen him stick the rifle out of the window. The driver then admitted to hunting the field for hog and admitted to being intoxicated. The driver was arrested and charged with hunting without landowner consent and hunting non-game from a motor vehicle.

--Penny Pinching-- A Shelby County game warden followed up on an ongoing investigation of a hunting license when he shot a buck in 2019. The subject confessed to not buying the license to save money for college. Case pending.


--Mama's Got Your Back-- Two Harris County game wardens followed up on a local poaching complaint and discovered a suspect who had harvested a white-tailed doe had done so without landowner consent. The suspect confessed to poaching and when asked to collect the deer meat, was surprised to find his mom had hidden the illegal deer meat under the couch while the wardens visited with him outside the home. Multiple charges and restitution pending.

--Holy Crappie--An Upshur County game warden received an anonymous tip about a substantial amount of fish that had been cleaned and dumped at Lake O' the Pines near Ore City. The warden and his partner responded and inspected the property where the fish were dumped and discovered that two out of state fishermen were responsible. The two fishermen had been fishing every day for a week and were staying at a motel at the local marina. Further investigation revealed 273 crappie, 173 fish over the legal state possession limit, were taken, filleted and stored

local individual who had hunted without a valid in ice chests and freezers on the property. More than 350 crappie fillets were seized and donated to multiple families around the area. Multiple charges and restitution pending.

> --Turtle-y Illegal-- A warden was notified about a complaint regarding a local pet store in San Antonio that had a tortoise for sale. Upon inspection of the pet store, the warden seized a Texas Tortoise (a threatened species) that was "given" to the store. Further investigation revealed the store was also selling Mississippi Map Turtles and River Cooter Turtles without a non-game dealers license. The Texas tortoise was released back into the wild. Charges pending.

> --What's in the Bag?-- A Val Verde County game warden was patrolling the northern end of the county for white-tailed deer hunting compliance when he contacted several subjects who were acting evasive when asked simple hunting related questions. Further questioning revealed the group had been trespassing and duck hunting without licenses or duck stamps in between their deer hunt. The breasted-out ducks were found neatly stored in a potato chip bag. Multiple cases and restitution pending.

13. All fish must be caught on artificial bait by casting. (No trolling with gas engine). Pork trailer may be used.

14. Weigh-in starts at 3:00 p.m. (official clock at sign-in). You must be in the weigh-in line by 3:30 p.m.

15. All fish must be brought to the scales in weigh-in bags.

16. No iced or frozen fish will be weighed. Ice may be added ONLY to aid in survival of fish. 17. Each contestant will be responsible for weighing his or her own fish. (No pooling of fish).

18. Dead fish at weigh-in will be penalized 1/2 (.5) pound. All fish weighed in become the property of TTB and will be released (with the exception of trophy

or dead fish). 19. In the event of a tie for any position, prize money for that position and the following positions will be combined and evenly devided between the tying contestants.

20. Contestants may not have served as a compensated guide on Lake Fork 30 days prior to the tournmanet.

21. Contestants may fish with a guide on Lake Fork prior to the day before fishing this TTB tournament.

22. Use of alcoholic beverages or controlled drugs are prohibited during tournament hours. Prescription drug use should be declared at sign-in.

23. Anyone who has ever been disqualified for cheating or misconduct from any tournament is ineligible to fish.

24. Any contestant who violates any rule may be disqualified. Any act of a competitor, verbal or physical, that reflects unfavorably upon TTB's effort to promote fishing, conservation,

clean waters, courtesy or safety shall be reason for disqualification from this and all future **TTB tournaments.**

25. Parent or guardian must accompany contestants under 18 years of age.

26. All protests must be registered in writing with the tournament judges within 15 minutes after designated weigh-in time. All decisions of the tournament judges will be final in all matters. Anyone protesting the outcome of an open tournament will have to pay for any additional polygraph test given.

27. All boats are welcome to participate. An aerated livewell is recommended to aid in fish survival for live release. Anglers cannot leave boat to land a fish.

28. All contestants are responsible to have read these rules and must agree to abide by them (by signing the entry form) while competing in this TTB event.

29. Contestants will be subject to polygraph test. Failure to take and/or pass such a test will result in disqualification.
