TFFC Temporarily Closed for Public Visitation

has temporarily closed to visitors while Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) completes emergency repairs to a steel column that structurally supports the main visitor center building.

Unrelated to the recent renovation of exhibits, displays, and aquaria in the main visitor center, routine maintenance and repairs continue to be implemented at the facility. A roof replacement was recently completed to remedy leaks and moisture entering the main visitor center building. The moisture was found to have contributed to significant and critical corrosion of a steel structural support column, which was concealed behind an educational display. The condition of the steel column threatened the structural integrity of the visitor center building and represented a public safety hazard.

Out of an abundance of caution, TFFC will be temporarily closed while the steel column is repaired. Progress updates on the repair and the planned

Hunting, **Texas**

Licenses

Fall is upon us and for hunters and anglers that can only mean one thing, it is time to renew hunting and fishing licenses. Before taking the boat out or hitting the field, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) reminds hunters and anglers to purchase their new licenses for the 2025-26 season. Current-year Texas hunting and fishing licenses

(except the Year-from-Purchase All-Water Fishing Package) expire at the end of August. Licenses for the 2025-26 season went on sale Aug. 15.

Texans purchase more than 3 million hunting and fishing licenses annually, directly funding a magnitude of conservation efforts and recreational opportunities. Fish stocking, wildlife management, habitat restoration, public hunting leases, river access sites and Texas Game Wardens are just some of the many projects made possible by license sales.

A variety of licenses are available and can be

purchased through the official TPWD website, or pedited checkout process, allowing customers in-person at retail locations throughout Texas or TPWD offices. Licenses may also be purchased by phone at (800) 895-4248 during regular business hours, though callers may experience long hold times during the beginning of the season and other peak calling periods. A \$5 administrative fee applies to phone and online purchases.

All recreational licenses and endorsement stamps now have a digital option. The digital license option is available through online purchase only. Digital license holders must keep their digital license available via mobile device while in the field or on the water as they will not receive a printed license or tags. License holders must access and use their digital tags through the Texas Hunt & Fish mobile app. Digital licenses can be viewed through the Texas Hunt & Fish and TPWD Outdoor Annual mobile apps. For repeat license buyers, TPWD offers an exto re-purchase licenses bought in recent years.

Sale

Paper license holders may show an electronic copy of their license but must possess and apply physical tags for animals that require tagging. Several options exist for customers to provide proof of licensure other than their physical license, including: (1) an electronic photo of their licenses, (2) an emailed receipt of their purchases; (3) their account in the online license sales system; (4) by connecting their license to the Outdoor Annual or Texas Hunt & Fish mobile apps. Hunting and fishing regulations for the 2025-26 season are available online at outdoorannual. com, or via the free Outdoor Annual mobile app. Once downloaded, the app works without internet connectivity, making it easy for hunters and anglers to view regulations in even the most remote locations. Other features include license lookup,



"September Change in Weather Pattern!"

Ah, September is here. We should see a gradual change in the weather pattern, with slowly cooling temperatures and shorter days/ longer nights. With this change, September usually means "Junk Fishing 101," meaning everything in the tackle box will work at some point in the day at different depths, as

the day and month progresses. So, this means a crowded deck of rods on the boat and rotate through 'em.

This month usually brings back a shallow Crankbait bite at some point, so don't forget to dust off those boxes of square bills and make sure the hooks are good and sharp. Remember, you're rod tip position effects the depth of your crankbait. So, when I'm casting a square bill very shallow, I position the rod tip upward at a high angle, but during the retrieve I gradually lower it to get a little more depth with the lure. I prefer Seaguar InvizX Fluorocarbon for this technique, from 12 to 20 lb test, depending on the size of square bill being used. A mid-depth crankbait is also very effective this month after the sun gets up high. I fish the around creek channel edges and main lake points.

bite in bass fishing. So, keep the frog rod rigged and ready! It's not cold enough, yet, for the vegetation to start dying off and running the bass off and the shorter days and easing temperatures can get the frog bites coming again. I like 65 or 50 lb. test straight braided line for this technique. A lighter, smaller on the Shakey Head, letting the rod load up, before setting the



Shakey Head Worm Rig has accounted for some big September Bass for us in mid-depths around brush, docks or rip For us frog fishing addicts, September can bring back the best rap. A 6-7 inch trick style, straight tail worm on a 1/8 to 3/16 Oz Shakey Head is preferred for this pattern. I find that in the morning, when fishing a brush pile, casting the perimeter to be more effective for big bass and easier for most folks to get them in the boat. For the best hook-up ratio, reel into the bite

hook with a "forearm set."

On extremely tough September days, whip out the Ned Rig on 'em and get the Skunk off. Don't let its diminutive size get in the way of using the Ned. I recall a guide trip several years ago about this time. I had been doing the best on Ned Rigs and tried handing my client one. He quickly declined and laughed, asking for a iig. I obliged. I started casting the Ned Rig and stuck a 6 plus pound Bass. The client quickly changed his mind and asked for a Ned Rig. Good times with a repeat customer.

Now as far as the crappie excitement, we are



starting to check the deeper areas of the lake like deep water humps, points, and any bends in main creek channels. They like to have quick access to shallow and deep water. So check any drop-offs or ledges and always look for baitfish. Right now we are targeting 12 to 18 ft. in 20 to 30 ft. of water.

The colors working for us have been Limits Tackle live baby shad in blue gill or white/chartreuse, Skipper Baits in LSU purple/chartreuse or white/chartreuse and Bonehead slim stick in white/chartreuse. also taking a very slow presentation so try your best not to overwork your bait. All you need is a little twitch now and then so you can stay in contact with your bait (and don't stop watching your line).

Now for those of you still looking for bream, they have been in 1-5 ft. around the new and full moon. Other than that, look in 5-20 ft. around any structure. Crickets or night crawlers or Berkley Power Wiggles will work.



location-based functionality such as "Hunting Seasons and Regulations by Location," "Where to Fish," and more. A limited supply of printed booklets will be available at select TPWD offices. Hunters and anglers are encouraged to call their local offices to check availability. The Texas Hunt & Fish mobile app enables electronic submission of mandatory harvest reports, including alligator gar harvest reporting, and supports digital tagging of harvested deer, turkey, oversized red drum and spotted seatrout for digital license holders. The app also allows hunters to complete their on-site registration for many TPWD public hunting lands. Hunters can hunt on more than one million acres of public land with

When buying their license, resident hunters and anglers may wish to purchase an entry in the Lifetime License Drawing. Three lucky winners will each win a Lifetime Super Combo License and never need to buy a Texas hunting or fishing license again. Entries are \$5 each and can be purchased online, at any license retailer or by phone. The first entry deadline is Sept. 30.

When making their purchase, license buyers can also add a donation of \$1, \$5, \$10 or \$20 to help support the Hunters for the Hungry program, the Fund for Veterans Assistance or Operation Game Thief. Donations to the Hunters for the Hungry program provide hunters with

the purchase of an annual public hunting permit. a way to donate legally harvested deer to participating processors. The processed meat goes to local food banks to feed Texas families in need. Donations to the Fund for Veterans Assistance program provide grants to veteran service organizations and nonprofit charitable institutions, assisting veterans and their families at the community level throughout Texas.

Operation Game Thief is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit focused on protecting Texas' wildlife and natural habitats through community engagement, outreach and education. On September 13, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's (TPWD) Community Archery Program is partnering with Palo Duro Canyon State Park in Canyon to help the public "Explore Bowhunting." The event gives participants an opportunity to learn more about hunting with a bow and properly prepare to use archery equipment during hunting season.

"Whether you are a seasoned archer, beginner or just starting to gain interest in the sport of archery and bowhunting, this is a great event to hone your skills, further your knowledge and understand what it takes to be a successful bowhunter," said Adam Lewis, TPWD community archery specialist. "The event will focus on the necessary gear, proper concealment, anatomy and shot placement to improve accuracy and in turn reduce recovery time and the processing of your animal after a successful hunt. Record Breaking Participation During 29th Great Birding Classic

The Great Texas Birding Classic (GTBC), the biggest, longest and wildest birdwatching tournament in the country, celebrated its 29th year and hosted a record number of 226 teams with 1,315 participants statewide. The Birding Classic tournament awarded \$60,000 in conservation grants through team registrations and sponsorships, totaling more than\$1.2millionoverthelast29yearsforon-the-groundconservation work to acquire, restore and enhance native Texas wildlife habitats. "It's wonderful seeing families and friends return each year the Birding Classic has become an annual spring tradition for so many people," said Shelly Plante, Birding Classic Tournament coordinator. "I love that it gives people who love the outdoors an opportunity to support conservation projects all over the state while taking part in one of their favorite activities. It's a win-win! We have some fun things planned for next year's 30th annual event, and I can't wait to see what people think."

The tournament set several new participation records this year including 91 Big Sit teams, 49 adult regional Big Day teams and 40 Sunrise to Noon teams. "We are totally amateurs but just love the outdoors and the birds and love supporting the effort," said John Eaves, a

member of Statewide Big Day team, the Crotchety Crows. Participants saw a total of 425 bird species during the tournament, including 37 species of shorebirds, 21 species of hawks, six species of hummingbirds, 41 species of warblers and 11 species of vireos, just to name a few. "The boys absolutely loved the whole experience and are already making plans for next year," said Misty Ferguson, mom of Roughwings youth team Bun Brothers Bird Lovers from the Heart of Texas East. "They have caught the birding bugin earnest."

Each year the winning Birding Classic teams get to select which projects to fund, and as the tournament continues to grow, more funds are raised which are then donated to habitat conservation projects in Texas. "One of the great things about birding is the people you meet along the trail," said Bill Baker, member of Weeklong team Two Chicks & a Chat (sponsored by Dickinson Bayou Fleeting). "I am truly blessed to be part of the Great Texas Birding Classic. I continue to visit sites that have received GTBC funding and they only seem to get better and better. What an amazing influence the GTBC has had on small grant projects over the last 29 years. Quite a legacy indeed!" This event is made possible by sponsorship and registration

Game Warden Field Notes_

The following items are compiled from recent Texas Parks and Wildlife Department law enforcement reports.

-- Dude, Where's My Car? -- A Bexar County game warden was patrolling Calaveras Creek by boat because the banks are closed to the public when they saw a person trespassing then hide in the mesquite brush. The warden called for backup and two additional wardens and a K-9 officer arrived to assist. After an exhaustive search, they were still trying to locate the subject. One of the wardens continued navigating their vessel father north into the creek when they spotted someone walking on the other side. The subject was stopped and told he was trespassing. He said he didn't have any fish or fishing gear and was walking back to the roadway where his van was parked. The subject said his friend brought him to the property but had already left and was waiting at the van. The warden exited the vessel and walked along the subject's path where they found an ice chest with six tilapia, one black bass and a cast net. The man said he left the ice chest on the trail because he got scared. The K-9 handler radioed the warden to let them know the other suspect and van were gone. The man said, "How am I supposed to get home?" He told the warden his phone, wallet and money were in the van and his friend was supposed to wait for him and take him home. The warden arrested the man for criminal trespass, had him board the vessel and transported him to the Bexar County Jail. Case pending with the District Attorney's office.



Game Warden Field Notes (Continued from Page 22)

County game warden found an unaccompanied vehicle at a Nueces River crossing. Believing the occupants got into another vehicle and drove down the river, the warden drove to a hill overlooking the river a couple of miles away. There they saw four individuals walking down the river, three with gigs and spears and one with a fishing pole. The warden saw two of the individuals with snorkeling gear dive into the river with the gigs. Another person in the group waved to the divers, who proceeded to dive and emerged with a catfish at the end of a gig. The warden drove down to the group and discovered a fishing pole but no other fishing, gigging or snorkeling equipment. After searching the area, the warden found the gigs and spears, which had been thrown in the water and concealed. The gigged catfish were nowhere to be seen. The warden interviewed the four individually and found none of them had a fishing license. After talking with each subject, one

finally admitted to gigging a catfish and leaving it at

their last fishing spot some distance away. The catfish was retrieved and seized along with three gigs and spears. Multiple citations were issued with civil restitution.

--Not so Happy Hour-- A Coryell County game warden and Falls County game warden were patrolling the Lake Waco area of McLennan County when they noticed a vehicle pulled over to the side of the road. When the wardens attempted to pass the vehicle, a truck cut them off, driving down the wrong side of the road. The vehicle pulled back over to the side of the road and waved the wardens to drive by. During the traffic stop, the wardens noticed the driver was unable to turn down the music on his radio. When asked what he was doing, the driver said, "I was just trying to..." The driver then picked up his beer and handed it to the wardens. The driver's speech was slurred, and he was unable to keep his balance as he exited the vehicle. After the Standard Field Sobriety Test was administered, the driver was transported to the McLennan County Jail and was booked into jail for a DWI. A blood specimen was obtained. The case is pending.

—His Name is Mudd (Bugs)—A Jefferson County game warden followed up on information from a social media post where a subject was selling live crawfish. When the warden contacted the seller, he claimed to own a catering company that sold live crawfish to local restaurants and individuals. The sale of live crawfish for commercial and personal use would require a Texas Wholesale Fish Dealer License. The man claimed over the phone that he was properly licensed in Texas and Louisiana. After requesting an in-person meeting with the subject, the warden discovered that the subject did not possess any type of commercial license and his vehicle was not properly marked to transport aquatic products.

-Don't be Shellfish-- Two Jefferson County game wardens were patrolling the ship channel near Port

Arthur when they saw a commercial truck about to be loaded with a pallet of shrimp at one of the local wholesale shrimp processing facilities. They stopped to inspect the vehicle and discovered it already had a cargo of 15 crates of fresh blue crab on board. The driver was acting very suspicious and claimed to have bought the crabs legally in Louisiana and transported them into Texas, which requires a Texas Wholesale Fish Dealer License. The driver could not produce a wholesale license or an aquatic product transportation invoice, or other documentation for where the crabs had originated. Wardens for the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries were contacted to assist with the investigation. They interviewed the dealer in Louisiana where the driver claimed the crabs had originated and discovered that the driver was being deceptive. Texas game wardens seized all 15 crates of crabs and sold them to the highest bidder as required by law. The driver was issued citations and given warnings.

--Oh-Fish-ially in Trouble-- Galveston County

game wardens received a call about two individuals who were catching sheepshead fish with a net and keeping over their bag limit. The wardens saw two over-flowing coolers with fish. When the wardens asked how they caught all the fish, they said, "with the net". When inspecting the coolers, the wardens found two hidden bags also containing fish. The two individuals were in possession of 47 sheepshead (27 undersized), three speckled sea trout and one 28" red drum. Multiple citations were issued to each individual. Cases are pending.

--Kids Say the Darndest Things-A Polk County game warden received a call from county dispatch regarding a father and his 9-year-old son who had gotten stuck in their buggy deep in a deer lease. They attempted to walk back to their camp and got lost in the process. County dispatch was able to ping their location within a three-mile radius. Once in the area, the warden was able to follow the tracks to the father and son. Dad commented to the son, "Yeah, might be bad luck being the second time we've been stuck

together," as the son responds, "but each time, dad, you were driving." The warden responded, "you're a smart kid," and presented him with a Texas Game Warden badge.

-- Seedy Situation -- Cargo was being inspected at a Dallas-Fort Worth Airport by Customs and Border Protection Agriculture Specialists and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Inspectors when they came across packages containing what they claimed to be steel nippers. The package didn't have the expected weight and was opened for inspection. Inside the box was numerous bags of vegetable seeds and dried shrimp. A package contained Ipomoea Aquatica seeds (water spinach), which is a harmful aquatic species in Texas. A second package claimed to be shirts. Wrapped inside the clothing was a bag that also contained Ipomoea Aquatica seeds. It is illegal to import or possess seeds in Texas. The cases were referred to a Tarrant County game warden and the packages were seized as evidence. The individuals who imported the products were issued citations. The cases are pending.


